

Define the “Economic Whole” under management

Its name:

Decision makers	
<p>Identify the people, including yourself, who are responsible for the management decisions in this economic whole.</p> <p>Consider if there is someone with the power of veto, and (if necessary) include them here.</p>	
Our Resource Base	
<p>Note the people and organisations that influence your decisions in this economic whole, but you have not included as a decision maker.</p> <p>Note any members of your ‘A’ team by name. You can probably deal with the myriad bureaucracies in a general ‘cover-all’ statement.</p>	
<p>List the physical resources you can access, that enable your decisions to come about.</p> <p>May include land (and/or other resources) that are available for you to use, even though not owned by this economic whole eg property and plant leases etc.</p>	
Our sources of money	
<p>Note all the sources of money that flows into this economic whole now.</p> <p>There is no need to quantify the amount of money, just that there are various sources, such as income from business activities, off-farm income (rental houses, work, shares) and sometimes government grants etc.</p>	

Temporary holisticgoal for:

Quality of life we desire	
<p>Write down the conditions and 'experience's' you desire in life. People often talk about experiencing prosperity, good health, great relationships, leisure time, new knowledge etc. Use the 'first person' (I/we) and 'present tense' (have). You are writing down things that are necessary for a good life. It is not a wish list. If you cannot delete the item it is a 'Quality of Life' requirement for you.</p>	
Forms of production	
<p>For each Quality of Life statement, identify what must be created or achieved in order to attain it. For example, prosperity may require you to produce a 'true profit', good health may require 'healthy work and living practices', and so on. NB: One Form of Production sometimes satisfies several Quality of Life statements.</p>	
Our future resource base	
<p>Land: Describe how the land that supports your 'Forms of Production' must become. Think about long term ecosystem functionality.</p> <p>People: Describe how you must be known by others, so that they want to relate to/ work with you, rather than others.</p> <p>Community: Describe the sort of community your actions should produce. This will enable rather than retard creation of the required Forms of Production.</p> <p>Infrastructure: Describe the qualities that future infrastructure should exhibit eg functional, accessible.</p>
